## **Conversing with Jesus**

This time of prayer focuses on *Psalm 23*. Pray *Psalm 23* two times: the first time for understanding, the second time from the heart. Follow the steps that are listed below.



Begin your prayer with the Sign of the Cross. The Sign of the Cross affirms our belief in the three Persons of the Triune God and that we are saved by Jesus' death on the cross.

Sign of the Cross

## In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

(Pray together aloud when praying with others)

Jesus, please give me the grace to quiet down inside so as to become aware of Your love for me. Jesus, I want to spend this time with You. Help me to give You my full attention & to pray from my heart.



The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want; In verdant pastures He gives me repose. Beside restful waters He leads me; He restores my soul. He guides me in right paths for His name's sake.

Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for You are at my side. With Your rod and Your staff that give me courage. You spread the table before me in the sight of my foes; You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Only goodness and kindness follow me all the days of my life; And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for years to come.

- **<u>EXPRESS</u>** silently your sorrow for any sins you committed, remembering that all sin offends God.
- **PRAY** *Psalm 23* a second time, silently from the heart, more slowly than the first time.
- <u>CHOOSE a word or phrase from the Prayer that stood out for you. Silently think about it, speak</u> with God about it, (and share it aloud with those with whom you are praying).
- **<u>T</u>HANK** Jesus in your own words for a blessing received. (Share this aloud.)
- **<u>A</u>SK** the Lord for any request that is in your heart. **(**Share this aloud.)

## Close your time of prayer with the Sign of the Cross

## Dear Parents,

In order to help your son or daughter to go deeper in their relationship with Jesus, one specific prayer has been given to them. Young people are encouraged to develop a personal prayer time in addition to family prayer time. A wonderful way to support your son or daughter in personal prayer is to let them know that you will include *Psalm 23* as part of your quiet time with the Lord each day.

**Why pray...** Praying *Psalm 23* throughout the entire year will allow you to encounter Jesus in a deeply personal way and help you to understand what it means and feels like to have a friendship with Him. As you spend time with Christ in conversation (in prayer) you will become more aware of the lessons from Psalm 23: God is love; God is faithful and can be trusted; and God will never let you go. Take time each day to be with Jesus by praying *Psalm 23* so that you come to know this to be true.

When to pray... With most things in life, when you schedule something, it takes place. When you don't, it usually does not happen. Choose a specific time to pray and ask Jesus to strengthen your desire to pray, leading to a stronger commitment: in the morning, after dinner, in the evening. As you speak with the Jesus each day in prayer, you will come to recognize more and more how much He loves you and find **peace** and **calm** in the midst of life's difficulties.

It is common to experience **distractions** during prayer. It is important not to follow the distraction, but as you notice it, simply turn back to the prayer at hand. If the same distraction keeps returning, it could be something you will want to talk about with Jesus.

Where to pray... Set up a sacred space in the home, keeping it simple. It is helpful to have a picture or statue of Jesus to help stay focused on Him during prayer time. The following may be included in the sacred space: a Bible, a Crucifix.

**Who is Jesus?** Jesus is God. Jesus Christ said, "I am the Good Shepherd, and I know My own and My own know Me." (John 10: 14). He knows you, with all of your talents, strengths and weaknesses, and He loves you. Take time to be with Him and to get to know Him. As *Psalm 23* expresses, Jesus wants to help you with your every need.

When we pray for something, we can trust that God will answer every prayer in a way that is best for us. Remember, sometimes the answer will be "yes," sometimes the answer will be "no," and sometimes the answer will be "not now, but later" as God's timing is perfect.

You can further support your young adult in personal prayer by initiating discussions during this year. Here are several "conversation starters."

- I understand that you are praying the *Psalm 23* on a daily basis. I am also committed to praying this prayer each day. What stands out for you in this prayer? Then offer what stands out for you.
- Have you experienced something as a result of this prayer? Do you feel comfortable sharing that with me? Would you like to hear the effect that it is having on me?
- Have you encountered the Person of Jesus in praying this prayer? Is your relationship with Him deepening?
- How are you being led to understand better Jesus as your Good Shepherd? May I relate what I have found?
- Are you growing in your awareness of Jesus' continual presence in your life?
